

A Guide to Never Longer-Acting Insulins

Long-acting insulins help you avoid having low blood sugar by: Staying in your body longer than short-acting insulins Keeping insulin levels stable throughout the day

Compared to other long-acting insulins, newer longer-acting insulins:

- Release insulin more slowly over time, keeping your levels even more stable throughout the day
- Inject less liquid with each dose
- May use pens that hold more insulin units, which may mean you need to manage fewer pens
- May need fewer injections depending on your dose

Newer Longer-Acting Insulins

Toujeo (U300 Glargine)

AVAILABLE DOSES

- 300 units/mL: 1.5-mL pen = 450 units per pen
- 300 units/mL: 3-mL pen = 900 units per pen

WHEN TO TAKE

1 time a day at the same time each day

DOSE CHANGES

Wait 3–4 days between dose increases

STORAGE



Unopened pens

- Keep in the fridge



Open pens

- Do NOT put in the fridge.
- Leave out in a safe place for no more than 56 days

Tresiba (Degludec)

AVAILABLE DOSES

- 100 units/mL: 3-mL pen = 300 units per pen
- 200 units/mL: 3-mL pen = 600 units per pen
- 100 units/mL: 10-mL vial

WHEN TO TAKE

1 time a day, at any time of the day



DOSE CHANGES

Wait 3–4 days between dose increases

STORAGE



Open pens and vials

 Keep in the fridge or leave in a safe place for no more than 56 days

Other Long-Acting Insulins

Basaglar, Lantus, or Semglee (U100 Glargine)

AVAILABLE DOSES

- 100 units/mL: 3-mL pen = 300 units per pen (Basaglar, Lantus, and Semglee)
- 100 units/mL: 10-mL vial (Lantus, Semglee)

WHEN TO TAKE

1 time a day. You can take it at any time of the day. But, once you pick a time, you should stick with the same time every day



DOSE CHANGES

Ask your healthcare provider

STORAGE

Unopened pens

Keep in the fridge



Open pens

- Do NOT put in the fridge.
- Leave out in a safe place for no more than 28 days



Open vials

 Keep in the fridge or leave in a safe place for no more than 28 days






AVAILABLE DOSES

- 100 units/mL: 3-mL pen = 300 units per pen
 - 100 units/mL: 10-mL vial

WHEN TO TAKE

- Your healthcare provider may tell you to take detemir 1 or 2 times a day
 - 1 time a day, take with dinner or when you go to bed

2 times a day, take dose 1 in the morning and dose 2 at night. Make sure the doses are 12 hours apart



OR

DOSE CHANGES

Ask your healthcare provider

STORAGE

Unopened pens

- Keep in the fridge



Open pens

- Do NOT put in the fridge.
- Leave out in a safe place for no more than 42 days



Open vials

 Keep in the fridge or leave in a safe place for no more than 42 days
